Summer learning ideas for children moving from Year 2 to Year 3

<h3>Reading Snap</h3> <p>Read a fiction and non-fiction book with the same subject. e.g. space</p>	 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Diary of a Wimpy Kid books • The Great Chocoplot • The boy who grew dragons (there are more in the series too) 	<h3>Poetry Alphabet</h3> <p>Read as many poems as you can where the first word or title start with a different letter of the alphabet.</p> 
<h3>Times Tables</h3> <p>Make up a board game that involves using your times tables. Then play your game.</p> 	<h3>Home Shopping</h3> <p>Make up a shop in your home. Price up objects or drawings of items ready to 'sell' to your family. Work out how much they add up to. Can you work out the change they need too?</p>	<h3>Spot the shape</h3> <p>Look at 3D objects in your cupboards at home. What 2D shapes do they have as their faces?</p> 
<h3>Can you find me?</h3> <p>Choose a toy to hide somewhere at home and write a set of instructions to find it. This would be great to do with a member of your family. Just remember to think of the start point!</p>	<h3>Write a Letter</h3> <p>Choose a friend to write a letter to telling them about the best day of your holiday.</p> 	<h3>Where would they go?</h3> <p>Think of one of your favourite traditional story characters. Where would they go on holiday if they could? Write where you think they would go and why. What would they do there?</p>
<h3>Picture This</h3> <p>Create a collage of your favourite summer holiday activities.</p> 	<h3>Bobbing About!</h3> <p>Fill a bowl or bucket with water (or you could use a paddling pool). Collect together different objects and decide if you think they will float or sink. Then test them out. <i>Check your adults don't mind the things getting wet first!</i></p>	<h3>Where Are You?</h3> <p>Cut out twelve identical pieces of paper or card. Choose six objects and draw a picture of each one on two of the cards. Mix the cards up and lay them face down in rows. Turn a card over and see if you can find the matching card. Each time you get one wrong, turn them blank side up again.</p>
